Zoning meeting: The Zoning commission is going to initiate an amendment to zoning regulations and is working on finalizing the ordinance.

Administrators Report: Virgil Giles informed council previously about the storm install behind the businesses. The Utility Department has finished the completion of the separation and he does not have the total costs yet but with the labor and supplies it could be up to \$30,000.00. Greenwich has renominated with EPA on construction we have went through the monitoring and design and now will be asking for construction. Should know something by the end of year, also working on OPWC. Mike Lloyd brought up a few trees that look dead on Railroad St. Virgil says that he will have to call in an outside vender to try to reach some of the limbs of trees that the Village can't reach. He was going to ask them to take a look at other trees as well.

Chief's Report: Chief reports an oversize load hauling a mobile home struck and hit a pole. Police were able to catch up with him about a mile before New Haven and issued a summons. The Democratic Party would like to set up a democratic wagon that they set up in different comminutes. There was a permit filled out, if there is no objection from council the chief will approve it. They are asking to set up on September 26th for 2 hours from 11:00 am -1:00 pm. Cles Inmon has issue of were the placement of the wagon will be set up. He doesn't like that they want to set up beside the Greenwich Improvement Groups sign. Mayor says we have to give them the right to set up. Mike Lloyd had asked the Chief if there was a contingency plan in set for protesters who come and start rioting inside of Greenwich. Mayor says to take the letters off of the sign up town. Mike Lloyd has heard rumors that a march was going to take place in Greenwich he said they were going to come back to Shiloh and come through Greenwich. He asked Chief if a permit was needed for a march. The Chief yes and he says he will have officers on standby with Huron County Sheriff's office and said he will have a

Attorney Palmer askes what Chiefs plan if they don't get a permit and askes everyone to behave if they come into town. Chief says if they come he will have officers available if there are any issues. Chief has purchased a cruiser for \$7,250.00 and will be picking it up on Friday. Loud mufflers are back even after they went to court on their citations. Reports are coming in that people are drag racing on Kniffin, his department is aware of it and will continuing to issue citations and vehicle inspections will be done. There is a trial coming up for the complaint of the chickens. No Drs. note has been given to Chief documenting that the chickens are actual therapeutic chickens. The vicious dog has been euthanized, Attorney Palmer says there was testimony given by several people and compliments the Chief on having good documentation for the case.
