AN ORDINANCE SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING THE 2024 PERMANENT APPROPRIATION MEASURE ORDINANCE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Village Council previously passed Ordinance No.: 2023-19 titled PERMANANET APPROPRIATION MEASURE setting the annual appropriations for the year and providing for the current expenses and other expenditures of the village; and

WHEREAS, Section 5705.38(A) of the Ohio Revised Code provides that during the year the taxing authority of the subdivision may pass any supplemental appropriation measures as it finds necessary; and

WHEREAS, Section 5705.40 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that any appropriation ordinance or measure may be amended or supplemented; and

WHEREAS, Section RC 705.18 of the Ohio Revised Code requires that supplemental appropriations shall not be made during the current fiscal year unless by an ordinance passed as an emergency measure; and

WHEREAS, an ordinance by village council is necessary when the appropriation amendment will result in a reallocation of the line item amounts approved in the village's permanent appropriation ordinance [See Village Officer's Handbook, March 2019, Chapter Six: Accounting Procedures, Section IX Amending Appropriations. (Page 6-12); and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Officer reports that the amendment(s) and supplement(s) herein are measures providing for appropriations for the current expenses of the village and should go into immediate effect pursuant to section 731.30 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Officer specifically reports that: *the village is in receipt of unanticipated funds.*

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF GREENWICH, STATE OF OHIO: (RC 731.18)

SECTION 1. That Council finds it necessary to supplement and amend the Permanent Appropriation Measure Ordinance No.: 2023-19 as follows:

SECTION 2. That the Village Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized and directed to obtain an amended certificate of funds from the County Auditor to reflect the additional appropriations, and the amended appropriations amended herein shall not be effective until receipt.

SECTION 3. IMMEDIATE EFFECT. [RC 731.30] That measures providing for the appropriations for the current expenses of the municipal corporation shall go into immediate effect.

SECTION 4. DISPENSE WITH THREE READINGS. [R.C. 731.17(A)(2)] That the legislative authority, upon a vote of at least three-fourths of its members, hereby dispenses with the rule requiring each ordinance or resolution shall be read on three different days.

SECTION 5. DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY FOR IMMEDIATE EFFECT. That by two-thirds vote of all the members elected to the legislative authority, this legislation is hereby declared to be an emergency measure pursuant to RC 731.30, being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety of the municipal corporation and shall go into immediate effect for the following reason(s): The immediate effectiveness is necessary to: *To provide for immediate expenses.*

SECTION 6. PUBLIC MEETING. That it is found and determined that all formal action of this public body concerning or relating to the passage of this Resolution/Ordinance were adopted in a public meeting open to the public at all times, and that all deliberations of the public body and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in public meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including all lawful ordinances and any applicable provisions of section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREFORE, this legislation shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
