VILLAGE COUNCIL OF GREENWICH, OHIO RESOLUTION NO.: 20<u>24</u>-R-22

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING VACATION TIME AND FULL-TIME SERVICE CREDIT FOR INCOMING VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the former village administrator recently tendered his resignation effective July 19, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the current Village Administrator was recently appointed pursuant to ORC 735.271 and began work on <u>08/26/2024</u>; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor reports that the incoming Administrator, and Village Council all discussed the issue of vacation prior to Administrator beginning work and all agreed to provide the incoming administrator with three weeks of vacation with full time service credit of ten years pursuant to Greenwich Code Section 252.03(a)(3); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 232, Section 232.08 of the Greenwich Codified Municipal Code of Ordinances provides as follows:

CHAPTER 232

Administrator

232.08 VACATIONS.

The Administrator shall be entitled to vacations as set forth in Section 252.03. (Ord. 708. Passed 11-16-82.)

WHEREAS Chapter 252, Section 252.08(a) of the Greenwich Codified Municipal Code of Ordinances provides in part as follows:

CHAPTER 252

Employees Generally

252.03 VACATIONS.

- (a) All regular full-time employees of the Village, whether receiving compensation on a yearly, monthly or hourly basis, shall be entitled to receive vacations as follows effective with 2021 vacations:
- (1) One week of vacation with full pay for each employee who has been continuously employed in full-time service for one year or more, with satisfactory service.
- (2) Two weeks of vacation with full pay for each employee who has been continuously employed in full-time service for two years or more, with satisfactory service.
- (3) Three weeks of vacation with full pay for each employee who has been continuously employed in full-time service for ten years or more, with satisfactory service.

- (4) Four weeks of vacation with full pay for each employee who has been continually employed in full-time service for fifteen years or more, with satisfactory service.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF GREENWICH, STATE OF OHIO: (RC 731.18):

SECTION 1. VACATION TIME CREDIT. That Village Council hereby authorizes and approves THREE WEEKS OF VACATION with FULL TIME SERVICE CREDIT OF TEN YEARS pursuant to Greenwich Code Section 252.03(a)(3) for the newly appointed administrator retroactive to 08/26/2024. Such full-time service credit herein shall be used for vacation purposes only and shall expire at such time where the current administrator's employment is discontinued.

SECTION 2. RETROACTIVE. That the Agreement will begin retroactively on <u>08/26/2024</u>. Village Council expressly intends the amendments adopted herein to operate retrospectively pursuant to Section 1.48 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. PERSONNEL FILE. The Fiscal Officer, on behalf of the mayor, is hereby instructed to place a copy of this legislation in the Personnel File of the current Administrator.	ce
SECTION 5. DISPENSE WITH THREE READINGS. [R.C. 731.17(A)(2)] That the legislative authority, upon a vote of at least three-fourths of its members, hereby dispenses with the rule requiring each ordinance or resolution shall be read on three different days.	on on
SECTION 6. DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY FOR IMMEDIATE EFFECT. That by two-thirds vote all the members elected to the legislative authority, this Ordinance/Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergence measure pursuant to RC 731.30, being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safe of the municipal corporation and shall go into immediate effect for the following reason(s):	Cy
