POLICE DISPATCHING SERVICES

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND FISCAL OFFICER TO ENTER INTO A WRITTEN AGREEMENT WITH THE HURON COUNTY SHERIFF FOR THE RENEWAL OF DISPATCHING SERVICES FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND TEMPORARILY WITHHOLDING EXECUTION AND PAYMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village requires dispatching service for its police department; and

WHEREAS, the Village currently contracts with the Huron County Sheriff for dispatching services to the Police Department which is scheduled to expire <u>June 30, 2024</u>; and

WHEREAS, the Huron County Sheriff has submitted a proposed contract renewal, a copy of which is attached hereto and expressly incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police remains satisfied with the dispatching services of the Huron County Sheriff and recommends the renewal of the Agreement.

WHEREAS, the renewal was previously authorized by Resolution No.: <u>2024-R-14</u>, however due to continued negotiations around the country regarding costs, the village would like to temporarily withhold execution and payments until costs negotiations have concluded between the townships, municipalities and the county commissioners.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT $\underline{\text{RESOLVED}}$ BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF GREENWICH, STATE OF OHIO: (RC 731.18)

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That Village Council hereby finds and determines that it is necessary to continue to obtain dispatching services for the police department.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That Village council hereby finds that obtaining dispatching services from the Huron County Sheriff is in the best intertest of the village and the police department.

SECTION 3. That the Mayor and Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a written Agreement renewing the dispatching services provided by the Huron County Sheriff to the Police Department pursuant to the terms and conditions as set forth in the contract in an amount not to exceed the sum of \$6,120.00 payable at §510.00 per month. SEE COPY ATTACHED HERETO AND EXPRESSLY INCORPORATED HEREIN BY REFERENCE.

SECTION 4. <u>DISPENSE WITH THREE READINGS</u>. That the legislative authority, upon a vote of at least three-fourths of its members, hereby dispenses with the rule requiring each ordinance or resolution shall be read on three different days. [R.C. 705.15 and 731.17(A)(2)]

SECTION 5. DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY FOR IMMEDIATE EFFECT. That by two-thirds vote of all the members elected to the legislative authority, this Ordinance/Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure pursuant to RC 731.30, being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety of the municipal corporation and shall go into immediate effect for the following reason(s):

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Resolution No. 2004-R. 23 Passed So The current agreement will expire 6/30/2024. SECTION 6. PUBLIC MEETING. That it is found and determined that all formal action of this public body concerning or relating to the passage of this Resolution/Ordinance were adopted in a public meeting open to the public at all times, and that all deliberations of the public body and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in public meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including all lawful ordinances and any applicable provisions of section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code. SECTION 7. TEMPORARY WITHHOLDINGS. That the Mayor and the Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized to temporarily delay the execution of the written contract and temporarily withhold payment until such time as price negotiations have stabilized and concluded. That this authorization and temporary withholding shall be in effect retroactively from July 1, 2024. That the Mayor and the Chief of Police are authorized to represent the interests of the Village in discussion with the County Commissioners and the County Sheriff to assure that there is no lapse in dispatching services. That further authorization to extinguish this temporary withholding, and authorizing the execution of this contract, and authorizing the payment of a certain amount not to exceed the authorization herein, may be made by Motion of Council. WHEREFORE, this legislation shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law. PASSED AND ADOPTED on this ATTESTATION (RC 731.20) We hereby attest and affirm that the foregoing legislation received the necessary affirmative roll call votes required for passage by R.C. 731.17. OR LEGISLATION READINGS ORC 731.17(A) (1) Each ordinance and resolution shall be read by title only, provided the legislative authority may require any reading to be in full by a majority vote of its members (2) Each ordinance or resolution shall be read on three different days, provided the legislative authority may dispense with this rule by a vote of at least three-fourths of its members. GREENWICH POLICE DEPARTMENT DISPATCHING CONTRACT

This agreement is entered into by and between the **Village of Greenwich**, Ohio and the Huron County Sheriff's Office of Norwalk, Ohio on this <u>2</u> day of <u>3024</u>, 2024.

WHEREAS the **Village of Greenwich** desires to have a quality dispatching service for its police department, and

WHEREAS, the Huron County Sheriff's Office will satisfactorily furnish dispatching service for the **Village of Greenwich**, for an extended period of time.

It is therefore agreed between the parties that:

- Huron County Sheriff's Office will furnish all labor for the operation of a 24 hours a day, 365 days
 per year, monitoring, and dispatching service on both the radio and telephone for the Village of
 Greenwich and its police department.
- 2. The Huron County Sheriff's Office will supply unlimited teletype service to the **Village of Greenwich** at no cost.
- 3. The **Village of Greenwich** shall supply the phone lines and pay the rental on said phone lines to the Huron County Sheriff's Office.
- 4. The **Village of Greenwich** shall pay to the Huron County Sheriff's Office the sum of \$6,120.00 payable \$510.00 per month, for the above service.
- 5. This contract shall remain in effect from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

Either party may terminate this contract before its expiration with no less than thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. Payment for dispatch service shall be prorated to date of termination.
