AN ORDINANCE PURSUANT TO ORC SECTION 721.15(A) AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY NOT NEEDED FOR VILLAGE PURPOSES WITH AN ESTIMATED VALUE OF ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS OR MORE

WHEREAS, Section 721.15(A) of the Ohio Revised Code provides that personal property not needed for municipal purposes, the estimated value of which is less than one thousand dollars, may be sold by the board or officer having supervision or management of that property. If the estimated value of that property is one thousand dollars or more, it shall be sold only when authorized by an ordinance of the legislative authority of the municipal corporation and approved by the board, officer, or director having supervision or management of that property; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police reports that the police department has supervision or management of the following property:

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police further reports that the personal property described herein is no longer needed for municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Chief of Police report that the personal property described herein has an estimated value of more than one thousand dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police recommends and approves the sale of the property described herein.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF GREENWICH, STATE OF OHIO, (ORC 731.18) to wit:

SECTION 1: UNNEEDED That Council hereby finds and determines that personal property described herein is no longer needed for municipal purposes.

SECTION 2: VALUE. That Council further finds and determines that personal property described herein has an estimated value of one thousand dollars or more.

SECTION 3: SALE AUTHORIZED. That the Chief of Police is hereby authorized to sell the following personal property:

SECTION 4. BIDDING. That pursuant to ORC 715.15(A) the Chief of Police shall make a written contract with the highest and best bidder after advertisement for not less than two nor more than four consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipal corporation or as provided in section 7.16 of the Revised Code (*Abbreviated publication*).

SECTION 5. LOWEST RESPONSIVE AND RESPONSIBLE BIDDER. That the personal property shall be sold in compliance with the Village Competitive Bidding Policy detailed in Greenwich Codified Municipal Code of Ordinances, Section 206.02 requiring each competitively bid contract the Village awards to be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

The vehicle shall be sold with a minimum bid reserve of no less than \$500.00.


SECTION 5. PUBLIC MEETING. That it is found and determined that all formal action of this public body concerning or relating to the passage of this Resolution/Ordinance were adopted in a public meeting open to the public at all times, and that all deliberations of the public body and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in public meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including all lawful ordinances and any applicable provisions of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREFORE, this legislation shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


