"Good evening, Mayor Twaddle, Council, and neighbors. Lisa Hauke, 22 West Main Street. I am here to stand up for our community's values against overreaching government surveillance, deceptive signage, and illegal traffic enforcement.

First, transparency and political overreach. On June 2nd, Chief Fox claimed we were getting a 'free speed sign.' The paper trail says otherwise. On March 17th, the Safety Committee met to discuss Flock Security. Chief Fox confirmed to me that this department is actively pursuing an automated license plate reader network. Masking mass corporate surveillance as a 'free sign' is deceptive.

When I submitted a public records request for the emails regarding this pursuit, Mayor Twaddle emailed me back and stated, 'We do not have any Flock cameras anywhere in the village.' Mr. Mayor, that is a deliberate deflection. I know we don't have them yet. My request was for your *communications* and *planning* records regarding the pursuit of them. Under the [Ohio Public Records Act, O.R.C. 149.43](#), you cannot hide documents about a proposed system just because the hardware isn't bolted to a pole yet.

Furthermore, when I emailed Council President Pro Tempore Beverly asking how residents can monitor this committee, she replied, 'Does one need to be scheduled?' Yes, it does. Under the **Ohio Open Meetings Act**, you are legally required to provide a clear, public system for notifying residents when committees meet. No more backdoor conversations.

Chief Fox seems unable to separate his personal liberal beliefs from his job duties to this deeply conservative community. Pushing for unnecessary, government-expanding technology violates our core Greenwich values. Look at Ohio: Dayton, Columbus, and Kent State all halted or axed their Flock programs due to public backlash and massive unauthorized search audits. We do not want that un-audited corporate footprint tracking our neighbors and families.

Second, jurisdiction. Under **Ohio Revised Code Section 4511.21**, speed zones must strictly align with recorded boundaries, or citations are legally invalid. Yet, our posted speed limits do not match our legal borders. Furthermore, leaving outdated signs up warning of automated camera enforcement when the cameras are gone is illegal intimidation. Our boundaries are completely misaligned, creating a severe training crisis. Officer Bush recently pulled me over entirely outside village limits, claiming he clocked me inside. Our officers literally do not know where their jurisdiction ends.



I demand three immediate actions tonight:

1. **Halt** all inquiries into the Flock surveillance network and release the hidden records.
2. **Remove** the deceptive, outdated camera signage immediately.
3. **Audit** all boundary signs, commission an updated plot map, and retrain officers on Ohio jurisdictional law.
